

#### **Quick Facts**

Uptick in students studying in Latin America, Asia, Sub-Saharan Africa

Major fields of study were STEM (23%), Business (20%), and the social sciences (19%)







#### **Keeping Students Safe**







#### Munn v. Hotchkiss School

- Fifteen-year old Cara Munn was bitten by a tick while hiking on a forested mountain in China during a summer trip organized by Hotchkiss School.
- The tick transmitted encephalitis, which in turn caused Cara serious neurological damage, leaving her permanently unable to speak.
- Cara and her parents sued Hotchkiss in federal district court, arguing that the school was negligent, failing to warn them and take protective measures that the trip might bring her into contact with disease-bearing insects.

A jury awarded them \$10 million in economic damages and \$31.5

#### Klotz et al v. World Learning, Inc.

- Janee Klotz was robbed, stabbed and sexually assaulted while studying abroad in Kingston, Jamaica.
- She was studying with the School for International Training in Brattleboro, Vt.
- Klotz and five others sued the company, stating that it "knowingly subjected the students to an unreasonable risk of serious harm."



# **Tips**Travel Safety and Security



When entering a building or room, immediately identify all available exit and rehearse how to get to them.



In early stages of an incident run, or if unable to run, hide.



Gravitate away from incidents and gatherings of all kinds, such as protests.



If violent contact is imminent and unavoidable – fight with what's at hand.



Heed the instructions of authorities; remain calm and cooperative if stopped and questioned by authorities.
