UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS-AUSTIN – TOUR & LUNCHEON INFORMATION

Founded in 1883, The University of Texas-Austin opened its doors to 221 students. Today, the total number of students is in excess of 51,000. UT Austin is home to Bevo, the longhorn steer (mascot); Bertha, the largest bass drum in the world, the LBJ library, the iconic 307 Ft UT Austin Tower, and many statues of historic figures who positively impacted growth and development of the United States.

Wednesday's tour begins with a visit and lunch at the famous Littlefield Home. Built 124 years ago, Major George Washington Littlefield and his wife, Alice, built the Littlefield Home in the grand Victorian style. Civil War veteran and cattleman, G.W. built the home for the next generations of Littlefield's, housing 30 nieces and nephews while they attended The University of Texas. After the university took possession in 1935, the home was used by different organizations, including a Naval ROTC complete with anti-aircraft guns on the front lawn. Today, the university hosts many events within this historic home.

The Blanton Museum of Art is home to more than 18,000 works of art. Permanent exhibits include European Art, American & Contemporary Art, Prints & Drawings, Latin American Art, Teresita Fernandez: Stacked Waters, and Ellsworth Kelly: Austin. Visiting exhibits include Vincent Valdez: The City and Eugene Atget's Photography and Print Culture in Nineteenth Century Paris.
